It was fun and easy and as peppy as Frank is. There were some really good dances taught this weekend, from easy beginner to intermediate-advanced classes. Some of the ones that filled the floor doing the evenings were BLURRED LINES by Rachael M. and Arjay Centeno, MIRRORS, by Will Craig and Amy Glass. Another favorite was MADNESS taught by Scott Blevins and choreographed by a promising new choreographer Vicky St. Pierre. Previews of the next day's dances were done each night under the fun-and-disciplined guidance of Jamie Marshall. The DJs kept the floors full day and night. Good job, J.P., Louie, and Ferrel in the beginner room.

I liked that the workshops started at 9:00 instead of 8:00 because you didn't have to rush so to get down to the lesson rooms and could enjoy eating the great buffet in the restaurant with omelettes made to order and nice pastries and all kinds of things. There are many restaurants within either walking distance or by shuttle that the hotel provides, everything from Chili's, Hooters, Denny's, and lots of other restaurants closeby. It looked like a solid intermediate. Lindy taught ISLAND SONG which was a very cute beginner contra dance. Junior's MAKE YOU FEEL WANTED was very nice. Scott Blevins and Lou Ann Schemmel's BOOTY CHUK had a lot of people on the floor during open at night. Marilyn McNeal taught BLACK VALENTINE by Kim Ray and MY SPANISH LOVE by Simon Ward. I really like this dance. As I said, Scott taught MADNESS. This was very popular this weekend. Not long and not really difficult, just a little tricky. Zachary Detweiller taught his new dance GET LUCKY choreographed with Michelle Ljungquist. I didn't take the class but I heard he had a big class for it. Marilyn McNeal also taught A LIQUID LUNCH by Francine Sittrop. This is a fast peppy dance that I think is going to do well. Another favorite that people mentioned to me was Will Craig's LOVE SOMEBODY. Guyton's NO LIFE AFTER YOU, TONGUE TIED, and YOUR LAST DAY were all popular and lots of people have said they are teaching them. Scott's first waltz, NEVER SAY NEVER, is quite dramatic and the floor was full for this one. He also taught a little beginner contra called M.C.B.A. that was adorable. You should check it out. There were so many good dances and I'm only one person but you will see them moving up the charts in the next few weeks.

There is one room dedicated to beginners at all of their events and they always have all of the instructors teach in there as well as in the int-adv classes. I think this is a nice touch and the beginners love getting to take classes from the people many of them have heard about but never met. Another one I kept hearing about was Rachael's and Simon's WHERE WE BELONG. I would say this is a true high intermediate but it was the favorite of many people. Lorenzo taught two separate HIP HOP/SOUL TECHNIQUE classes and people loved them. People also love Lorenzo. He is so friendly and such a great addition to the events. Scott taught FEEL, one of my all-time favs of his. Rachael taught FEEL THIS MOMENT, another hit for her.
