The previews for Friday were followed and preceded by open dancing and it was fun trying to remember a lot of dances after not doing them for a long time for many people. JP did a good job of keeping the floor full and finding dances that most people seemed to be able to remember after a couple of walls. The instructors for this event were:

There was a bunch of good dances taught this weekend so I will tell you about the classes I took and I know others will help me out by filling in the ones I couldn't take. I started Friday with OUT OUT taught by Dustin Betts. The floor was full and, even though this is quite a few counts, it is not difficult and it is super fun to do. I then took Scott Blevins' OH SO EASY, which wasn't. It is fun, though. I then took SUDA by Sobrielo and taught by Rachael McEnaney-White. We weren't sure she was going to make it because one of the twins was sick enough to have to go to the hospital the night before but she did come to teach two dances and went home after. SUDA was a fun dance, too. After that she was teaching CYBER SAMBA by Whitehouse and McKeever. I had to go somewhere then but saw the end and it filled the floor for the lesson and later that night in open dance so I'm going to have to learn it. Next I took DO MY THING because I didn't really know it although I had learned it before. Next I did CYBER DROP by Whitehouse and McKeever. I knew the dance but had been messing it up in a couple of places so I'm

glad I took the lesson because now I can do it without messing up. After taking all those lessons and not remembering anything, we had a dinner break and open dancing at night. Saturday is a busy day at events but we started with the buffet breakfast in the restaurant so were a little late for the beautiful new dance by Amy Bailey called TAKE YOU FOR GRANTED. After that was the Pro-Am Competition and I always watch that and appreciate how well people do. This is a neat concept started by Arline Winerman when the event was in Tampa (the event is now affectionately known as "Not Tampa." People ask an instructor who is teaching at the event or an instructor that they always take classes from or just know to do a dance with them (and you can also ask your friends to do it with you with the same instructor) and you are judged on how YOU perform the dance and are awarded a medal at the evening open dance time according the way YOU performed the dance as an individual and not if you do better than another person so everyone receives a gold, silver, or bronze medal. This portion of the event was handed down to The Roses Dance Team and Organization and they have done a super job. Think about doing it next year and register early so they will know how many people they are going to have. You can pick the instructor and the dance so it is a fun way to dance in front of judges and get some great tips to make you an even better dancer. Everyone did an amazing job!

Right after that was the USLDCC (United States Line Dance Choreography Competition). I never miss this one. There were actually 36 dances entered and it only took a little over one hour to do the entire competition. There were some excellent dances and it is always fun to see each competitor dancing them alone or with friends. Good job, Kelly as emcee, and the judges for getting through that many competitors on time.

Because of the competition running over a little and the time frame left, Tim "The Vibe" Johnson taught a really really fun dance called GO DOWN in less than half an hour. It was 64 counts and we still got to dance it twice. I was impressed. I was also impressed with Tim. He was so nice to everyone and very approachable and a great dancer and teacher. What more could we ask for? I'm sure we will be seeing lots more of him in the future. It was nice to have him as a newcomer to the US dance scene at a Florida Event! Next I took my favorite dance of the weekend, COLD SETS IN, an advanced dance by Richard & Stolan. This is NOT EASY but Dustin Betts did a really good job teaching it and I will definitely practice this one.

I was going to take LATIN FUSION by Scott Blevins and Jo Thompson-Szymanski and DON'T YOU HOLD ME DOWN by Darren Bailey, and STRESSED by Dustin Betts but I had to go home Saturday so I missed those dances and the show (which I heard was on the best ones in a long time) and the awards, so someone is going to have to fill in the rest of Saturday and what you learned on Sunday and I'll ask Stacy to add your reports to the EVENT tab on the site where she always adds reports in addition to mine.
